

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Education, Limestone Community High School, District 310, to be held in the Board of Education Room, at the High School Building on Tuesday, August 23, 2016, at 7:00 PM.

President Vollmer called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Roll Call: Present: Mr. Jim Bainter; Mr. Mike Bredernitz; Ms. Sara Callear; Mr. Robert Neal; Mr. Larry Winkler; and Mr. Michael Vollmer.

Also in Attendance: Dr. Allan Gresham; Dr. Denise Ryder; Mrs. Tara Stout, Mrs. Julie Powers, Miss Maddysun Whitelow, audience members.

Mr. Neal made the motion, seconded by Mr. Winkler, to approve the Minutes of the Regular Meeting held on Tuesday, August 9, 2016; Executive Session of the Regular Meeting held on Tuesday, August 9, 2016; Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Bainter, Bredernitz, Callear, Neal, Winkler, and Vollmer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Presentation from Audience on Agenda Items:

There were no presentations from the audience members present.

Mr. Bredernitz made the motion, seconded by Mr. Neal; to approve the payment of bills and payroll in the following amounts: Educational Fund, \$829,993.89; Lease Levy Fund, \$2,642.00; Operations and Maintenance Fund, \$64,617.91; Transportation Fund, \$12,500.39; Municipal Retirement Fund, \$16,084.91; Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund, \$10,820.96; Tort Immunity Fund, \$40,387.64; Fire and Safety, \$54,573.69. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Bainter, Bredernitz, Callear, Neal, Winkler, and Vollmer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Mr. Neal made the motion, seconded by Mr. Winkler, to approve Resolution LCHS 16-17: 1; Directing the Regional Superintendent of Schools for the County of Peoria, Illinois, to certify to the election authorities of said County the question of imposing a retailers' occupancy tax and a service occupation tax to be used exclusively for school facility purposes for submission to the electors of said County at the general primary elections to be held on the 8th day of November, 2016. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Bainter, Bredernitz, Callear, Neal, Winkler, and Vollmer. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Informational Items:

Dr. Gresham introduced Mrs. Julie Powers, the advisor for the Amulet and student Maddysun Whitelow. Mrs. Powers shared they attended yearbook camp over the summer and this is where the theme was chosen for the yearbook this year. They are very happy and proud with the finished product. The Board of Education Members thanked Mrs. Powers and the Amulet staff for all of their hard work and congratulated them on a very nice job.

Miss Maddysun Whitelow exited the meeting at 7:15 PM.

Dr. Ryder presented and reviewed the July 2016 Treasurer's Report.

Dr. Ryder presented and reviewed with the Board of Education Members the tentative FY '17 Budget. Mrs. Ryder highlighted a few changes that will take place in the next year that will impact the budget for FY '17. The tentative budget will be put on public display and will be finalized prior to the adoption on September 27, 2016.

Dr. Gresham reviewed with the Board of Education Members the final details of the Drug Testing Program. Currently there are dates set for drug testing. The Board of Education Members and Administration discussed the dates and percentage of students being tested. After much discussion, the Board of Education Members agreed they would like to have more dates added for drug testing therefore there were more dates added to the schedule.

The Regular Meeting moved to Executive Session at 7:48 PM.

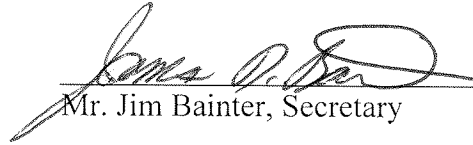
The Regular Meeting resumed at 7:52 PM.

MINUTES of a public meeting of the Board of Education of Limestone Community High School District #310, held in Bartonville, Illinois, which is located in Peoria County in said School District at 7 o'clock P.M., on the 23rd day of August, 2016.

The meeting was called to order by the President, and upon the roll being called, Mike Vollmer, the President, and the following members were physically present at said location:

Jim Bainter, Mike Bredernitz, Sara Callear, Bob Neal, Larry Winkler.

The following members were allowed by a majority of the members of the Board of Education in accordance with and to the extent allowed by rules adopted by the Board of Education to attend the meeting by video or audio conference:

No member was not permitted to attend the meeting by video or audio conference.

The following members were absent and did not participate in the meeting in any manner or to any extent whatsoever:

All Board members present.

The President announced that the Board of Education would consider the adoption of a resolution directing the Regional Superintendent of Schools for The County of Peoria, Illinois, to certify to the Board of Election Commissioners of said County the question of imposing a retailers' occupation tax and a service occupation tax at a rate of 0.5% to provide revenue to be used exclusively for school facility purposes for submission to the electors of said County at the general election to be held on the 8th day of November, 2016.

Whereupon President Vollmer presented and the Secretary read by title a resolution as follows, a copy of which was provided to each member of the Board of Education prior to said meeting and to everyone in attendance at said meeting who requested a copy:

RESOLUTION directing the Regional Superintendent of Schools for The County of Peoria, Illinois, to certify to the Board of Election Commissioners of said County the question of imposing a retailers' occupation tax and a service occupation tax to be used exclusively for school facility purposes for submission to the electors of said County at the general election to be held on the 8th day of November, 2016.

WHEREAS, Section 5-1006.7 of the Counties Code of the State of Illinois, as amended (the "*County School Facility Occupation Tax Law*"), authorizes the imposition of a tax upon all persons engaged in the business of selling tangible personal property, other than personal property titled or registered with an agency of the government of the State of Illinois, at retail in

The County of Peoria, Illinois (the "*County*"), on the gross receipts of the sales made in the course of business and a service occupation tax upon all persons engaged in the County in the business of making sales of service, who, as an incident to making those sales of service, transfer tangible personal property within the County as an incident to a sale of service, at a rate of 0.5% to provide revenue to be used exclusively for school facility purposes (the "*County School Facility Occupation Taxes*") if a proposition for the County School Facility Occupation Taxes (the "*Proposition*") is submitted to the electors of the County at a regular election and approved by a majority of the electors voting on the Proposition; and

WHEREAS, for purposes of the County School Facility Occupation Tax Law, "*school facility purposes*" means (i) the acquisition, development, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, financing, architectural planning, and installation of capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, and durable equipment and the acquisition and improvement of real property and interest in real property required, or expected to be required, in connection with the capital facilities and (ii) the payment of bonds or other obligations heretofore or hereafter issued, including bonds or other obligations heretofore or hereafter issued to refund or to continue to refund bonds or other obligations issued, for school facility purposes provided that the taxes levied to pay such bonds are abated by the amount of the taxes imposed under the County School Facility Occupation Tax Law that are used to pay such bonds; and

WHEREAS, for purposes of the County School Facility Occupation Tax Law, "*school facility purposes*" also includes fire prevention, safety, energy conservation, disabled accessibility, school security, and specified repair purposes set forth under Section 17-2.11 of the School Code of the State of Illinois, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the County School Facility Occupation Tax Law provides that upon receipt of a resolution or resolutions of school district boards that represent more than 50% of the student enrollment within the County, the Regional Superintendent of Schools for the County (the "*Regional Superintendent*") must certify the Proposition to the proper election authority in accordance with the Election Code of the State of Illinois, as amended (the "*Election Code*"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of (the "*Board*") of Limestone Community High School District 310, deems it necessary, advisable and in the best interest of the District that the Regional Superintendent certify the Proposition to the Board of Election Commissioners of the County (the "*County Clerk*") for submission to the electors of the County at the general election to be held on the 8th day of November, 2016 (the "*Election*");

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It and It Is Hereby Resolved by the Board of Education of Limestone Community High School as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles. The Board hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this Resolution by this reference.

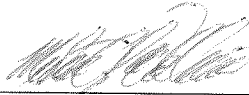
Section 2. Direction to Regional Superintendent. The Regional Superintendent is hereby directed to certify the Proposition to the Board of Election Commissioners in the form set forth in the County School Facility Occupation Tax Law and in accordance with the Election Code, for submission to the electors of the County at the Election.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or

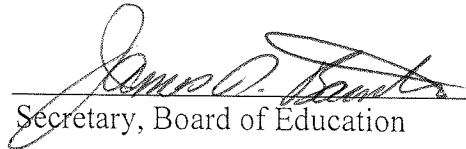
unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

Section 4. Repeal. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed, and this Resolution shall be in full force and effect forthwith upon its adoption.

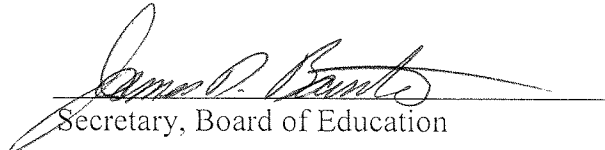
